A1 Background and Framework

- The Euro-Mediterranean Energy Ministers Conference, Rome, December 1 – 2, 2003 launched the Rome Euro-Mediterranean Energy Platform (REMEP) as the energy driver of the Euro-Mediterranean Partnership
- The REMEP Conference held in Rome, October 2004, decided that REMEP should have an Energy Secretariat and an action plan
- The Euro-Mediterranean Energy Forum Meeting of September 21, 2006 in Brussels confirmed the interest in REMEP of participating countries



A2 Why REMEP ?

- To implement the Euro-Mediterranean energy co-operation while providing effective and continuing technical support as needed
- To enhance the effectiveness of the initiatives promoted by the Euro-Mediterranean Energy Forum and the Euro-Mediterranean countries
- To further develop the Euro-Mediterranean Partnership and dialogue between the EU and the Mediterranean countries towards an energy community in the region



A3 MEDREG: A New Milestone

- The Mediterranean Working Group on Electricity and Natural Gas Regulation (MEDREG) was created on the occasion of the conference of the Euro-Mediterranean national energy regulators in Rome, 29 May 2006
- Strong institutional collaboration between REMEP and MEDREG is foreseen
- MEDREG will benefit from the back up by the Italian Government, the European Commission and the Council of European Energy Regulators (CEER) as well as the logistical support of REMEP



• Core activity including:

- ✓ energy data collection;
- ✓ information exchange;
- ✓ links to existing databases;
- ✓ review of existing energy partnerships.
- Directions of commitment:
 - energy market harmonisation;
 - cooperation on energy regulation and government-industry partnerships for energy project development;
 - ✓ new energy interconnectors and infrastructure;
 - ✓ sustainable energy development and renewable energy promotion.



B2 Energy Market Harmonisation and Coordination

- Creation of a database for the harmonisation of the energy policies
- Assess progress and perspectives of energy sector reform and of the legal and regulatory framework
- Develop appropriate set of tools such as demand/supply forecast, performance indicators
- Identify national energy institutions and their roles

B3 Co-operation on Energy Regulation (MEDREG)

- Common analysis and comparison of existing energy legislation and regulation
- Organisation of shared specialised training, technical assistance, exchange of know-how and experience
- Development of common positions on regulatory issues, including criteria related to cross-border electricity and gas trade
- Promotion of Euro-Mediterranean regional electricity and natural gas markets towards their integration
- Promotion of harmonised, transparent and non discriminatory market rules

B4 New Energy Interconnectors and Infrastructure

- Establishment of a database for the main energy investment projects in the Euro-Mediterranean Region
- Defining prerequisites and prospects for the gas and electricity Med-Ring as well as other interconnectors
- Monitoring the implementation of oil, natural gas and power infrastructure
- Promoting the optimisation and use of existing financial support schemes and further financial support



B5 Sustainable Development & Renewable Energy

- Establishment, in coordination with Euro-Mediterranean Countries, of an information system to support policy makers in their response strategies to environmental challenges towards sustainable development
- Studies to promote energy efficiency and expand the use of renewable energy sources in the Euro-Mediterranean region while defining financial support mechanisms
- Designing a facility for flexible mechanisms aimed at energy efficiency and deployment of renewable energy sources



B6 Outreach Action

- European Mediterranean Partnerships
- Energy Community of South-East Europe
- OME
- European and international financial institutions



C1 The Energy Secretariat Organisation and Operation

- The Energy Secretariat will have a flexible and light structure to play a role of catalyst, to take advantage from the existing mechanisms and programmes, to activate co-operation networks and maintain working groups which are already operational
- The Government of Italy has foreseen to provide the Secretariat, based in Rome, with:
 - ✓ initial resources and staff;

- ✓ infrastructure and equipped offices;
- ✓ a web portal (with e-mail address and logo);
- contacts and agreements with existing organisations for collaborations;
- ✓ training of a technical group.



C2 The Energy Secretariat Operations

- A charter will define the criteria and guidelines for the operation of the Secretariat
- Transparency will be ensured while abiding to the rules of the European Commission
- A High Level Energy Steering Committee made up of representatives from the European Commission, the Euro-Mediterranean countries and major financial institutions will provide the Secretariat with directions and priorities
- Secondment of personnel and contributions are foreseen by participating countries and EU Member States



D1 The Steps Ahead

- The Energy Secretariat will be operational within the year 2007 including the finalisation of the draft of charter, definition of legal status and work plan
- Meeting of the Experts' Group of the Euro-Mediterranean Energy Forum, Brussels, 16 October 2007
- 9th Euro-Mediterranean Meeting of Ministers of Foreign Affairs, Lisbon, 5-6 November 2007
- The Euro-Mediterranean Energy Ministers Conference, winter 2007/2008 should mark REMEP take off and operation


