





Cyprus in relation to Europe



- Civilization since 10 millennium BC.
- Being a cross road between Europe Asia and Africa – many conquerors
 - Greek, Romans, Byzantines, Venetians, French, Turks, English
- The first Roman province to be Christianized by St. Paul and Peter
- 1878-1960: British rule
- 1960-Independent Republic
- 1974-Military Coup-Turkish Invasion controls 37% of the island in the north
- Population around 880.000
 - 80% Greek Cypriots
 - 11% Turkish Cypriots
 - 9% foreigners

Some Facts about Cyprus


- **Official Languages**: Greek and Turkish (English widely spoken)
 - 76% of the population of Cyprus speak English,
 - 12% speak French, and
 - 5% speak German.
- Cyprus is ranked as the 5th safest country in the world and the 2nd safest in Europe after Norway
- With almost 4 million tourist arrivals per year, it is the 25th most popular destination in the world. Mostly British, Russians, Greeks, German, Scandinavians, visit the island for holidays
- The body of Cypriot students is highly mobile, with 78.7% studying in a university outside Cyprus. The tourist industry has many high qualified personnel but there is a lack of lower skilled staff.

More Facts about Cyprus

- On an average, Cyprus receives 40 days of rainfall each year and an average of 300 sunny days. During the summer 40 C are common. This is a factor to be considered especially if you are willing to work in the tourism sector.
- The touristic summer period starts in April until end of October.
- Most of the hotels are in the area of Agia Napa, Protaras and Pafos, but hotels can be found all over the island
- It is estimated that in 2019, 3000 vacancies cannot be filled by local staff

Working in Cyprus



- EU Nationals have the same rights as Cypriots
- EU Nationals need no visa or work permit

When you find employment in Cyprus



Step 1: Apply for a Registration Certificate

- At the local Immigration Branch of the Police or the District Migration Office
- In a period of 3 months after arriving in the Republic. The Registration Certificate is issued to all EU citizens wishing to stay in Cyprus longer than 3 months and they either have secured employment or they have sufficient funds for their stay.
- EU citizens not satisfying the above will not be able to stay in the republic and they may get deported

Passport or ID

Contract or Salary advise

Fee of 20 euros per application

Step 2: Apply for Social Insurance number

This is done only after you start working It will be done by your Employer as soon as you are hired.

Documents needed: ✓ Passport or ID

Social Insurance

Covers <u>compulsorily</u> every employed or self employed person

For the employed:

- •8,3% paid by employee (gross salary)
- •8,3% paid by employer
- •3,9% by State

Taxation



Register for Tax Identification Number in your Local Tax Authority.

Documents needed:

- Passport or ID
- Fill in Form IR 163A

Personal income tax – according to level of income per year: (deducted monthly from your salary)

- Up to €19.500...... 0% tax rate
- €19.501-€28.000 20% tax rate
- €28.001-€36.300 25% tax rate
- over €36.301 30% tax rate

Minimum Wage

Only few Occupations are entitled to minimum wage by Law:

- Office clerks,
- Shop assistants,
- School assistants,
- Assistant baby and child minders,
- Nursing assistants,



 Employees with sanitation and caring duties in clinics, private hospitals and houses for the elderly.

€870 gross monthly on appointment

€924 gross monthly after 6 months of continuous employment

For all other occupations (including tourism), wages are agreed with the employer bilaterally or based on collective agreements and personal

contracts.



Health Insurance

All EU citizens must have their EU Health Insurance Card when coming to Cyprus for work.

- In 2019 the NHS is Introduced
- ◆ EU Citizens who are temporarily in the Republic are entitled to use the Public Hospitals submitting the European Health Insurance Card and pay the fee of €15 for visiting general physician and an amount of € 30 for a visit to a specialist doctor.
- All Employees contribute 2.65% to the NHS which is deducted from their salary
- ♦ Medicines cost €0,50 each, for a max. total of €10.
- The same rights enjoy all family members of the card holder



Accomodation

- ea,
- Rent is not cheap: depending on area, establishment, average from €350 per month for a small studio to few thousands for a villa
- Employers can help you find shared accommodation with other employees
- Electricity bills: around €60 per month
- Water bills: around €15 per month
- Building maintenance fees: around €20-40 per month

Employers may deduct an amount from your salary if they provide you with accommodation or meals

Transport

Driving on left-hand side



- Public transportation network is being developing with the network increasing (€1,50 euros for a bus ticket)
- Inter-city busses connect all cities (€4,00 per ticket)
- Radio Taxis available (minimum charge €7,50)
- Inter-city Service Taxi (€8-10 for sharing of a taxi bus)
