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Living Costs... Transports



Several low-cost **airlines**, including RyanAir, EasyJet, Vueling, Condor, FlyBe, TUIfly and Transavia operate flights to and from Portuguese airports

Portuguese airlines (TAP Air Portugal and SATA) operate regular domestic flights between the main airports throughout national territory (Lisbon, Porto, Faro, Funchal and Azores islands)

'Alfa Pendular' **trains** (fastest link between Lisbon, Porto, other northern cities and the Algarve)

The cities of Lisbon/Amadora, Almada and Porto/Gaia have a **metro** (underground) network that operates between 6.00/6.30 am and 2.00 am

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Healthcare

National Emergency Services: 112

- Medical services from the NHS (National Health System) free to EEA citizens working or looking for work in Portugal
- When travelling to Portugal, don't forget your *European Health Insurance Card*
- Once you start working, and after being registered in Portuguese Social Security, **register** with the **nearest Health Centre**
- Health Centres: general practice/family medicine, public health care, nursing, vaccination and some diagnostic exams
- **Public Hospitals**: external specialist consultations, hospitalization and emergency services

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Preschool education: for children between 3 and 5 years old **Compulsory schooling**: free of charge, runs up to the 12th year or until the age of 18

Higher education: includes universities and polytechnics

- academic year begins in September/October
- admission depends on the number of vacancies available
- applications submitted online in July and early August

In order to be accepted, EU/EEA/Swiss nationals must hold an academic qualification equivalent to the 12th year of schooling (upper secondary school).

There are also several private **international schools** operating in the country (mostly in the Algarve, Greater Lisbon & Porto areas)

For **academic recognition** of basic or secondary qualifications contact **Directorate-General for Education** in Lisbon; for higher education diplomas contact **NARIC**.
